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### Entry Part I - Section II - 1. Professional Development / PR Skill Building

### Explanation / Overview of Year-Long Effort

- a. In an effort to support the professional growth of our members, INSPRA annually plans a series of workshops we call Tips & Tactics (T&T). In the 2011-12 school year, there were six T&T sessions:
  - i. Friday, Oct. 21 Organized and Efficient: How to Better Manage Your Time and Space
  - ii. Friday, Dec. 9 Annual Idea Exchange: Give (and Get!) the Gift of Networking
  - iii. Friday, Jan.20 Financial Forecasting and Planning for a Referendum in Challenging Financial Times
  - iv. Friday, Feb. 17 Inspiring and Infusing Strategy in Planning, Advising and Internal Communication
  - v. Friday, March 16 Technology Update for the School Communications Professional
  - vi. Friday, April 20 Best Practices in Design and Photography
- b. This series is designed by the INSPRA Board during our summer planning meeting. The session topics are based on the results of an annual survey completed by INSPRA members. The survey asks members to identify issues they believe they will face in the coming year. The survey also asks members to choose from a variety of standard "hot topics" in school PR. The survey data, combined with the input and insight of the Board members, make for a powerful offering of sessions that truly help our members grow.
- c. In addition to the actual workshop, which is typically about two hours in length, the T&T sessions are also an opportunity for sharing Chapter announcements and news, as well as facilitating networking opportunities for our members. Prior to the start of each session, members gather over breakfast treats to socialize, to problem solve, and to share best practices. We also ask anyone new to INSPRA or to the workshops to introduce themselves.
- d. Each T&T session concludes with a live "Member Needs Help" a member with a challenge can ask the audience for suggestions on how to handle the issue. This year, we also used the T&T events as an opportunity to draw a name to determine who will be featured in our Member Spotlight, an article that gives an individual a "moment in the sun," which is posted on our INSPRA website.
- e. New for 2011-12, INSPRA was approved as a provider of CPDUs (Continuing Professional Development Units), which will continue to be a major draw for administrators and demonstrates the Chapter's commitment to excellence in professional development for educators.

### Chapter Goals for Programs

- a. Some of the goals of INSPRA are:
  - i. Be the leader in providing professional development opportunities for school PR professionals in Illinois
  - ii. Be the source for unparalleled networking opportunities for school PR professionals in Illinois.
- b. Our members continually name T&T sessions as the most relevant and timely source for strengthening their PR skills and knowledge base. Likewise, the program's frequency, effectiveness, and style fosters in-person connections among school PR colleagues that can be found nowhere else, which continually lead to year-long relationship building among our peers.

### Meeting Programs / Agendas; Marketing Materials; Tip Sheets; PowerPoint Presentations

- a. Enclosed is the T&T overview program flyer that outlines each of the six topics focused on in 2011-12, as well as the individual flyer drafted for each event.
- b. Enclosed is an example of a PowerPoint presentation, given during the October 21 session "Organized and Efficient: How to Better Manage Your Time and Space."

#### Specific Activities

a. Specific activities were the T&T sessions themselves, each complimented by outstanding speakers, helpful handouts, and exceptional resources provided to all attendees.

#### Target Audience (Participation Lists)

a. The target audience for each T&T is the complete INSPRA membership, which includes approximately 150 individuals. In addition, members are encouraged to invite other members of their administrative teams to join relevant sessions. For example, the March 16 session focused on technology updates, and so several INSPRA members invited their Technology Directors and other technology-focused colleagues to the event. At the April 20 session focused on design and photography, we welcomed several attendees who serve as graphic designers in their school districts.

#### Outcomes / Effectiveness


a. In an effort to determine the success of each session, INSPRA provides a hard copy (paper) evaluation to all attendees and reminds attendees to complete it at the conclusion of each T&T program. In addition, the annual membership online survey always includes a question focused on the T&T program. The Co-Vice Presidents of Programs and President review the hard copy evaluations following each program, and the complete Board reviews all hard copy evaluation results and the online survey results during our summer planning meeting. An example of the hard copy survey and the online survey question are enclosed.

#### Relation to NSPRA Goals and Objectives

a. One of NSPRA's goals is to be the professional organization that is indispensable to school public relations professionals and other education leaders. As one of NSPRA's strongest chapters, the Illinois Chapter continues to be a model of professionalism, creativity, excellence, and resourcefulness. Our Illinois members use the word "indispensible" when describing our organization regularly, as there is no other group like INSPRA in our region. Our strength only serves to in turn strengthen the national organization. Our members know the value of INSPRA and fully understand our relationship and partnership with the national office and other chapters throughout the country.

#### Other Relevant Examples

a. One additional example of professional development provided by INSPRA is a workshop held in September, which precedes our annual Communications Contest luncheon. The event often draws a crowd of educators beyond the communications team, and so the INSPRA Board and event committee aims to focus each workshop on a topic that is of interest to a broader audience of school officials. In September 2011, we hosted the workshop and luncheon in Maggiano's restaurant (Oak Brook, Illinois). The speakers were Dr. Ehren Jarrett and Dan Woestman and their focus was 21<sup>st</sup> Century Presentation Skills. Enclosed is the event invitation, as well as the program summary.

- 1) I don't have time to write up press releases every day. Many times, instead of writing a release, I just pick up the phone and call them and give them the details and a contact number. They take it from there.
- 2) I also save the time of writing up the story myself by just linking to the ones the reporters wrote. It gives them a boost and saves me some writing.

- Learn what are the priorities of the school district AND your Superintendent AND your School Board
  - Hopefully these are all aligned!



#### What

- Learn what you want to share with your audiences
- May be different to different audiences: Dual Language to incoming parents; fiscal responsibility to business leaders
- Look beyond the immediate need...craft messages today for your needs 3-5 years from now (referendum, etc.)
- Learn what others want you to share with your audiences

### When

- In a one-person office, when takes on extra significance!
- Learn about timing in your environment
- · When to pitch story ideas to the media
- When to ask for budget increases (or salary increases) from your superintendent
- When are the important meetings and events in your district and in your community



### When

- In your first year, develop a calendar of major events of the school year so you can anticipate them in subsequent years

### Where

- Learn the geography of your district
- Learn about the communities and the "subcommunities" in the area you serve
- Learn where helpful resources are within your district
- 1T
- · Someone who is good at proofing and/or editing
- Someone who can help with last minute projects: mailings, events, etc.

### WHY: Find out why you are there

- Why is there a communications/PR position?
- There is almost always a specific reason
- Why was there an opening? (if this was an existing position)
- Why did they hire you?
