Outcomes Achieved The program had 68% of its participants show measurable academic growth, as indicated by pre-and post-screening data, up 3% from the summer before. Additionally, it set a goal for participants to achieve an average Brigance kindergarten readiness score of 70 based on these assessments and the actual average readiness score reported this past summer was 75, a remarkable achievement. Another significant outcome is that 80% of the program participants demonstrated proficiency in the social-emotional skills necessary for kindergarten success, as measured through a pre-and post-rating scale. In summary, this video serves as an essential communication tool that not only highlights the impact of the United Way of Southern Kentucky's grant funding but also outlines the comprehensive approach of KinderReady Summer Academy, while also showing viewers the value of community-based partnerships in providing students innovative learning experiences.
