

Jennings Creek Elementary School's Thursdays Live Jennings Creek Elementary is a school that proudly serves a diverse student body, with 100% of its students qualifying for free and reduced lunch, according to the Kentucky Department of Education (KDE) qualifying data. The student body also represents over 50 nationalities, reflecting rich cultures and experiences. The students speak more than 25 languages, making Jennings Creek a vibrant multilingual environment. Notably, 55% of the students are English Learners (ELs), showcasing the school's dedication to inclusive education and the importance of language support through creative learning opportunities.

Music Program Initiative To enhance the artistic development of its students, Jennings Creek launched a new music program known as "Thursdays Live." This initiative was designed to allow students to explore their musical talents before the school day begins by offering opportunities for students, faculty, staff, parents and community leaders to participate in live music sessions, so that all students could access the wonder of live music. As a result of this program, 25 students have been identified as "gifted and talented" in the performing arts-an impressive achievement considering that prior to this initiative, no students had been designated "gifted" in this area.
