

In April of 2024, Buffalo and the Western New York area were the center of the celestial universe, site of a total solar eclipse. A total solar eclipse occurs when the moon passes directly between the sun, blocking the light from reaching Earth, and immersing the region in total darkness. To help inform and engage with our school community, we created Total Solar Eclipse flyers that were sent home with faculty and staff prior to the Spring recess. The flyer included information on:

- The time and duration of the total solar eclipse
- How to properly wear solar eclipse glasses (through a student video)
- How to track the eclipse across its path of totality
